

## Introductory and Advanced Courses Mark Fall Semester

The Fall Semester features advanced linguistic studies in Greek and Hebrew, as well as a number of introductory courses for new and intermediate students. Courses open to all enrolled students include Introductory Greek, Systematics, Reformation Church History and Introduction to Apologetics.

### Mon., Thurs., 6:30-7:45 PM

**Greek I:** A study of New Testament Greek, including orthography, grammar, syntax and vocabulary, including selected readings from the New Testament. The instructor will be Dr. Frank Walker.

### Mon. 7:50-9:30 PM

**Exegesis of Hebrew Narrative and Law:** A study of the unique contributions of the Hebrew language to an understanding of the narrative and law of the Old Testament, especially the writings of Moses. Selected passages of the Old Testament will

be read and studied. Attention will be given to the creation account of Genesis 1 and 2. The instructor will be Rev. Michael Voytek.

*Prerequisite: Advanced Hebrew Grammar (OT131)*

### Tuesday 6:30-8:10 PM

**Systematic Theology: Soteriology and Pneumatology:** A study of the work of the Holy Spirit in salvation, focusing in particular on regeneration, effectual calling, conversion, faith, justification, adoption, sanctification and the perseverance of the saints. The instructor will be Rev. Jim West.

### Thurs. 7:50-9:30 PM

**Reformation History:** A study of the sixteenth-century Reformation, focusing on the pre-Reformers, the relationship between the Renaissance and the Reformation, the work of the Reformers (specifically Luther, Zwingli, Calvin and Knox), and the

Roman Catholic Counter-Reformation. The instructor will be Dr. Frank Walker.

### Sat. 9:00-10:40 AM

**Introduction to Apologetics:** A study of the presuppositional method of apologetics as the proper Biblical strategy for defending the faith. Attention will be given to competing methodologies, including rationalism, empiricism (evidentialism) and irrationalism. The instructor will be Dr. Charles McIlhenny.

### Sat. 10:50 AM - 12:30 PM

**Exegesis of Romans:** An exegetical study of the book of Romans, focusing on its major themes of sin, redemption and thankfulness. The correct method of presenting and defending the faith will be emphasized throughout. The instructor will be Dr. Frank Walker.

*Prerequisite: Advanced Greek Grammar (NT131)*

Students may pick up course syllabi, review textbooks and discuss course content with the instructors. Course descriptions that list the required readings, exams, papers and the schedule for each class will be available for review. Students may apply for admission to the seminary, fill out registration forms and apply for financial aid. A Financial Aid officer will be on hand to answer questions.

The first Open House is scheduled for Thursday, July 29th, from

7 to 9 PM at the **Natomas Community Center** located at 2901 Truxel Road. The Center is easily accessible from both Highway 5 and Highway 80.

The second is scheduled for Monday, August 30, from 7 to 9 PM at the **Clunie Community Center** in McKinley Park (Alhambra Blvd. side of park).

“We are trying to hold Open Houses in different areas of the city,” commented Kurt Snow, Chairman of the Board of Governors. “We have used facilities in East Sacramento at the SMUD headquarters. In the south area we

have held Open Houses at the Belle Coolidge Center and the Fruitridge Community Center. Eventually, we hope to hold Open Houses in the Roseville and Folsom areas and perhaps in outlying areas. We want to make the Seminary as accessible as possible to the whole region.”

## City Seminary to Offer Continuing Education Units Association of Christian Schools International grants CEU recognition

The Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) has announced that City Seminary’s Biblical studies “will be accepted toward satisfaction of ACSI certification requirements.”

ACSI is the leading association of Christian elementary, junior high and high schools worldwide. In the Sacramento area, there are over fifty member schools.

Teachers at Christian schools are encouraged to seek ACSI certifica-

tion — a program that provides professional credentials. The heart of the certification is ACSI’s emphasis on biblical studies, believing that the Christian school teacher benefits greatly from “training in the Biblical philosophy of education (and) formal Bible instruction....”

Continuing Education Units (CEUs) are used by many professions as a measure of ongoing training that is required to maintain credentials.

Courses offered during the Fall 2004 Semester that meet the CEU requirements are Introduction to Apologetics, Exegesis of Romans, Exegesis of Hebrew Narrative and Law, and Soteriology (the doctrine of salvation).

## Rev. Reddit Andrews Joins Board of Governors

Rev. Reddit Andrews, pastor of Soaring Oaks Presbyterian Church in Elk Grove, has joined the Board of Governors of City Seminary.

Rev. Andrews has a keen interest in training men for the ministry. As a student, he served as student chaplain, spiritual life advisor, and Dean of Chapel at Trinity International University, Deerfield Campus, and as President of the Association of Believers for Black America in Illinois. Reddit also founded Coram Deo, a student fellowship that ministered to halfway houses, rescue missions and prisons throughout South Florida. Pastor Andrews was awarded a B.A. in Biblical Studies from Trinity International University, South Florida Campus in 1997 and a Master of Divinity from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in Deerfield, Illinois in 2000. He served as an assistant pastor at two different congregations prior to accepting the call to serve at Soaring Oaks. For the Seminary's 2003/2004 Convocation Service, Rev. Andrews preached the charge to the faculty.

"I believe whole-heartedly in the work of City Seminary," said Rev. Andrews. "City Seminary is a place where a student called to the ministry can be assured of a thoroughly biblical and academically rigorous seminary education. This seminary is an enormously important asset to the believing church here in the Sacramento region."

"We welcome Rev. Reddit Andrews to the Board of Governors of City Seminary," added fellow board member Al Esquivel. "As a man working day-to-day in the ministry, he brings a pastor's perspective to our work as a board. It is a privilege to have him."
