II. Course Description

A continuation of NT 101 — Elements of Greek I. This course will continue to build the student's understanding of Greek vocabulary, grammar and syntax. The purpose of this class is to prepare the student to read and exegete the New Testament in its original language. Three units. Prerequisite: Greek I or the professor's permission to take the class.

This class will meet every Monday and Thursday evening between January 19 and May 7, 2009, from 6:30 PM to 7:45 PM, except during the weeks of March 2 and April 6.

III. Required Texts

IV. Course Requirements

a. Homework

Daily translation exercises will aid the student in mastering the Greek of the New Testament. These exercises must be turned in at the end of each class. The four lowest scores will be dropped before computing the student's grade for the course. Homework assignments will count as 25 percent of the student's grade.

b. Quizzes

Daily quizzes will monitor the student's comprehension of the material. The four lowest quiz scores will be dropped before computing the student's grade for the course. Quizzes will count as 25 percent of the student's grade.

c. Tests

There will be a total of two examinations in this course: a mid-term (February 26) and a final (May 7). Each exam will count as 25 percent of the student's grade.

d. Attendance

Students are expected to attend all classes. In the event of unavoidable absence, the student should seek excuse from the instructor beforehand. Two excused absences are permitted without a reduction in grade. Recipients of Mission to the City Scholarships with more than two unexcused absences will be billed full cost for the course.
